An average of 2,672 children 0–3 are served per month by the Child Care and Development Fund

In Federal Fiscal Year 2006 the Infant/Toddler Child Care and Development Fund Set-Aside = \$396,907

180 children served by 4 grantees are in Early Head Start

65% of all the requests for child care to the child care resource and referral programs were for infant and toddler care





In Center-Based Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:3 for 6 weeks to 24 months (with a max. of 6) OR 1:4 (with a max. of 8); 1:5 for 12 to 24 months (with a max. of 10) OR 1:4 (with a max. of 12); 1:5 for 18 to 36 months (with a max. of 10) OR 1:6 (with a max. of 12)

These ratios apply to infant and toddler child care centers, which have their own licensing regulations.
(State Licensing Regulations)

In Family Child Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:6 (with no more than 2 children under 18 months)
(State Licensing Regulations)

In Group Family Child Care the staff-to-child ratios are

1:8 for 2-year-olds; 1:12 for 3-year-olds

Children 0 to 24 months are not permitted in Group Family Child Care.

Average annual fee for full-time child care for an infant in center based care..... \$9,192

Cost of child care for an infant as percent of median income for two-parent families 13%

Cost of child care for an infant as percent of median income for single parent families..... 37%
