68% of all the requests for child care to the child care resource and referral programs were for infant and toddler care





80% of South Carolina Women with Children Under the Age of 3 Are in the Labor Force





In Center-Based Care the staff-to-child ratios are

- 1:6 for 6 weeks
- 1:6 for 9 months
- 1:6 for 18 months
- 1:10 for 27 months
- 1:13 for 36 months
