

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SYSTEM TOOL: FOCUS ON CORE KNOWLEDGE AND COMPETENCIES

This tool was developed to serve as a guide for commencing development or revision of a State/Territory core knowledge and competencies document. It is divided into three planning areas: core knowledge areas, levels, and additional sections/formats. The listed core knowledge areas are not meant to be exhaustive but to support discussions about ways to categorize content; combining and/or extending the listed areas is encouraged. Bulleted examples of possible specifics under the core areas are included and may contribute to the development of competencies.
